Reminders from the CE Office

Continuing Education Activity Application Tips

- Directly Provided Activities: Planning committee must be comprised of at least two-thirds WMed faculty and/or staff
- Jointly Provided Activities: Planning committee includes less than two-thirds or no WMed faculty and/or staff
- Applications should be submitted at least 90 days prior to the start date of the activity
 - Course applications <u>will not be accepted within 60 days</u> of the start date
 - RSS applications <u>will not be accepted within 45 days</u> of the start date
